

# **South American Wood Blanks**

### 1. Purpleheart (peltogyne venosa)

Color is a dull brown when freshly cut, but quickly turns purple upon exposure to sunlight.

# 2. Bocote (cordia gerascantus)

A small tree seldom growing larger than 12" in diameter. Heartwood is a yellowish brown accented with black lines. Freshly cut Bocote has a green tinge, and is oily to the touch.

#### 3. Cocobolo (dalbergia retusa)

A medium size tree growing up to 2 feet in diameter 90 feet tall. Heartwood varies from a bright orange to a deep red with attractive varied stripes of yellow, black, and orange. Darkens on exposure. A fine texture and excellent color make Cocobolo one of the most popular exotic woods.

## 4. Pau Amarello (euxylopora paraensis)

Straight to slightly interlocked grain, very fine even texture.

#### 5. Goncalo Alves (astronius fraxinifolium)

A large tree that can grow 150 feet tall and 50 inches in diameter. Heartwood is reddish-brown with dark brown streaks. Medium texture and interlocked grain, this turns and finishes extremely well.
